Who Does Alabama Medicaid Serve?









FY 2020 Medicaid Expenditure Analysis Benefit Payments and Administrative Costs (in millions)




FY 2020 Medicaid Funding Analysis State and Federal Funding (in millions)

Alabama Medicaid 2022 State Funding Need

FY 2021 Appropriation \$820 million



Factors Affecting 2022 vs. 2021 Request

Normal Factors:

- Carryforward
- FMAP Changes
- Recurring inflationary increases
 - Nursing Homes
 - Pharmacy
 - Medicare Part B Insurance

COVID-19 Factors:

- Increase in provider cost of doing business
- Unemployment impact on enrollment
- Public Health Emergency end date



FY 2022 Potential Financial Risks



Potential Financial Risks Post-COVID-19

- Eligibility redeterminations on regular state FMAP
- Financial needs of providers once federal dollars are diminished
- Increase in utilization
- Increased payment for vaccine administration
